



# 1912-13 KING GEORGE V - DIE PROOFS

Between 24 January 1912 and 23 September 1913 a few die proofs were produced, all in black. Besides the undenominated designs, only the high values  $(3/-to \ \text{fl})$  were produced.

3/- die proof in black on white paper, dated 27-3-12 on the back. (C)






# 1913 KING GEORGE V 1/2d. - PAPER TRIALS

These experimental paper trials were part of De La Rue's work to provide a source of coloured papers for the Crown Agents. Only the 1/2d. plate was used and it is known on white, yellow and blue surfaced papers with white backs.









### 1922 KING GEORGE V - PRINTERS SAMPLES

In 1922 De La Rue made up sample books for the use of their salesmen. The Falkland Islands stamps selected were the 2d. and 10/- values.

The 2d. exists imperforate and overprinted SPECIMEN but also perforate and imperforate without Specimen overprint.

The 10/- exists perforate and imperforate, both with SPECIMEN overprint.



JALIKLAND ISLENDE KING GEORGE V 1912

The design of the past two reigns was continued with the addition of the Crown and the words Postage and Revenue when it was adapted for the King George V issue. This issue was also printed by De La Rue & Co Ltd, values up to 1/- in sheets of 60 stamps (ten rows of six), higher values in sheets of 30 stamps (five rows of six).


GALIKLAND ISLENDE 1921-28 KING GEORGE V

In 1921 the Multiple Script CA watermarked paper came into use and future printings were done on that paper, values up to 1/- in sheets of 60 stamps (ten rows of six) and the 3/- in sheets of 30 stamps (five rows of six), all comb perforated.






# TWO PENCE HALFPENNY - VARIETIES

SCREW-MARKS IN MARGIN, the printing plate was re-surfaced before the 1928 printing and when it was remounted on its wooden frame it was fixed with additional screws in the bottom left and right hand corners. The marks made by the heads of the screws can sometimes be seen in the margins.




In 1922 the foreign postal rate increased from 2 1/2d. to 3d. so the colour of the 2 1/2d. value was changed to purple on yellow paper.

## 1928(7-22 February) "2 1/2D" on Two Pence

Towards the end of January 1928, whilst whaling operations were in full swing, there was a sudden and unexpected demand on the part of at least one of the whaling factories for an unusually large quantity of 2 1/2d. stamps, which exhausted the current supply of that value, and decreased the 1/2d. stamps in stock to well below the margin of safety required for current use, eventually resulting in the exhaustion of the stock. As mail was shortly due to leave something had to be done, so authority was sought from Port Stanley to meet this emergency, and by telegram dated 25 January 1928 the surcharging of the current 2d. stamp was authorised from Stanley. (1 179 surcharged)





# "2 1/2D" on Two Pence - VARIETIES

SURCHARGE PARTIALLY DOUBLE, the result of the difficulty in using the small surcharge handstamp.

A poor strike was applied first, showing parts of the surcharge only, so another complete strike had to be applied.
